Y11:- January and February is ALL about last post-16 visits & submitting applications for 6th forms, colleges and APPRENTICESHIPS. It is really important that every student applies to at least 2 post-16 venues so that they can have a plan A and a plan B. I would also recommend that any student who is wanted to get an apprenticeship after SVS also applies for a college course as a plan B (If unsuccessful before Sept 24 students are able to continue to apply for apprenticeships while at college and then just transfer from a course to an apprenticeship as and when they secure one).

Y10:- Please continue to hunt for work experience placements – there are some great ones being advertised at the moment.

Y10:- Subject Experience days at Hartpury are now being advertised for Sport, Animal and Agriculture open to Year 10 students.



On **Wednesday 6 March 2024**, at our Gloucester campus, we are hosting one of our most popular annual events for school leavers, college students and anyone interested in an apprenticeship to learn how apprenticeships work and the career paths they lead on to.



Understanding Post-16 Qualifications

There are 4 main choices on how to study Post-16: T'levels, A'levels, BTECs and Apprenticeships and to make it even more complicated within BTECs and Apprenticeships there are different levels of qualifications ranging from Level 1 to Level 3. GCSE estimated grades will give Y11 students some guidance on which of the course might be the best one(s) for them to consider and I would always recommend students have an 'aspirational choice' and a 'safe choice' (similar to how university choices are done).

T'levels – Gloucestershire's Cirencester College has been at the heart of these pioneering Level 3 qualifications. They are a 2-year technical study programmes designed in partnership with employers that combine class room training and a 45+ day industry placement. Cirencester Collage (and to a smaller extent Gloucestershire College and Stroud College) has a selection of T-levels that include subjects as diversity as Accounting to Adult Nursing, Horticulture to Business Management and Broadcast Production to Engineering. These courses have been devised in close contact with employers to ensure that students have the practical skills to ensure they are 'work ready'.



A'levels – are Level 3 qualifications, are studied across 2 years and students normally study 3 A'levels plus an additional qualification like EPQ or completing DofE Gold etc. Some university courses will expect students to have studied certain subjects at A'level and as a rule of thumb it would be beneficial to have a 6+ at GCSE in order to study a subject at A'level. Students are able to study A'levels at Cirencester and Hartpury College and school 6th Forms.

BTECs – are practical-based, vocational qualifications. They can be studied at a college or some school 6th forms and they provide the opportunity to gain hand-on experience in a field or subject. BTEC Level 1 & 2 are equivalent to GCSEs and Level 3 is equivalent to A'levels. Students can progress from a L1 through to a L3, normally over a 3-year period.

In addition to the above, colleges like Cirencester College offer Foundation Year courses, meaning students spend 3 years rather than 2 at the college. These are for students who are not quite ready for T'levels or A'levels and include work experience, GCSE resits, project qualifications.

College

We are extremely lucky in Gloucestershire to be served by a wide variety of colleges, all of which have different strengths and focuses. From Hartpury's countryside management course through to SGS's Sports Journalism BTEC, no matter what your passion there are Post-16 courses to aid you to get your dream job. Please click on the below college name to be taken to their website. Below you will also find up-to-date information on college open-days and taster sessions.

During the summer holidays Y10s need to research the different colleges and decide if they are interested or not in any of the courses they have to offer – please note not all of Gloucestershire College's courses are in Gloucester and some of SGS's courses are in fact in Bristol!


One-to-One Careers Appointments

Re: Year 10 Work Experience and Apprenticeships in Early Years Education

I am writing to offer a work experience placement with All My Friends Childcare in the 2024 Summer Term to Year 10 students currently studying Child Development as a GCSE option.

To ensure each student has the best possible experience and gains an understanding of the operations of an Early Years setting and discovers the magical world of development, exploration and experience, through a child's eyes, we only offer 2 placements at any one time.

The students will spend time in each of our 3 age groups to gain an understanding of the stages of child development, safeguarding and health & safety rules as well as being hands on and supporting children to access activities and experiences during their sessions.

Students wanting to be considered for placement are required to independently enquire by calling 01452 505 515 option 2 or emailing louise.h@allmyfriendschildcare.co.uk One of the setting team will then be in contact for an informal chat and to arrange a pre-placement interview. All students applying for a placement will need to commit to undertaking the placement for the full week.

In return we offer a safe, welcoming and friendly environment for those first steps into the world outside formal education. Each student will receive a short induction and a named 'buddy' for support. Upon completion of the work experience week, we will provide them with an individual summary for their portfolio, including the opportunities offered, an overview of their participation, attitude and hours worked during their placement.

For Year 11 students wanting to transition from school to undertake a work-based apprenticeship in Early Years, we commit to 2 apprenticeships joining us each September. We invite applications from students at the start of each calendar year. Where students have not achieved a pass in GCSE Maths and/or English, our designated training provider will run functional skills alongside the qualification. Post-16 Timeline

I have had some requests from parents & students for a suggested timeline around Post-16 applications – please find a guide below for Current Year 11s (leaving SVS in June 2024):-

July -September 2023 - There are lots of school Sixth Forms and Colleges in Gloucestershire and so using the summer holidays to whittle them down to a shortlist may well be a sensible first step in deciding where to go after Severn Vale School. Why not begin researching via Unifrog or 6th Form / Colleges own websites. Aim to compile a short-list of Post-16 choices by the end of September, having checked first that your GCSE estimated grades are on target to meet the course requirements. Following this you need to apply to attend a selection of open-days / open evenings (Top tip - If applicable - remember to research what student bursaries are available for you to apply for e.g. travel bursaries).

Sept - November 2023 - Attend at least two College or Sixth Form open-days (these may be inperson or virtual open-days depending on Covid-19). Most colleges only have a couple of open days a year, while some Sixth Forms only have one a year and so you do need to get organised early. Please note you will find many of the popular colleges open-days get full early. (**Top tip** - Severn Vale School will be issuing all students with a list of open-days at the start of September but some are already being advertised (see Colleges & Sixth Form pages of Newsletter for more information)).

FLD 23rd November 2023 - Severn Vale School will be taking all of Year 11 off timetable for the day to allow them to visit a Post-16 destination of their choice. Transport will be provided by Severn Vale School, however as students are only able to visit one venue, it is important that students choose carefully. As well as getting to see the facilities, an open day is a great opportunity to find out more about the different courses on offer from those who teach and study it - current students and academic staff. (**Top tip** - For many students choosing a college or sixth form is a bit like buying a house - and so you may well find that you end up going with your gut feeling and choosing the college or sixth form that feels like it could be your home for the next 2 years. Remember what is right for your friends might not be right for you).

November – December 2023 - January 2024 - Submit applications to College / Sixth Forms (**Top tip** - you can submit multiple applications and can also accept courses at more than one provider, and you do not need to decide on where you are going until GCSE Results Day in August 2024)

December 2023 – Complete, via Unifrog, your Post-16 destination form, remembering to include a Plan A and a Plan B – this information will allow us to be able to review all of Year 11s applications and do a check on suitability and ensure all of Year 11 have the balance right between being aspirational and attainable.

January - February 2024- If appropriate - apply to local grammar schools - please see their website for the application window (normally only a few weeks).

February - July 2024 - If appropriate - apply for apprenticeships via either Unifrog or Find and Apprenticeship website <u>Find an apprenticeship (findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk)</u>

August 2024- GCSE results day - decide on which Post-16 place you are going to enrol at.
